Itinerary*

Day 1 Departing your local departure point we travel to Kent and the 4 Star Bridgewood Manor Hotel, our base for the next 4 nights with dinner, bed and breakfast provided.

Day 2 We spend today at Chatham's Historic Dockyard, with exhibits including three historic warships and interactive galleries. We can explore the architecture, ships and people that shaped British Maritime innovation, engineering and design.

Day 3 This morning we visit Chartwell, which was purchased by Sir Winston Churchill in 1922 and used during the 20's and 30's as his main base for writing, painting and entertaining. In the afternoon we make our way to the Biggin Hill Memorial museum built in 1952 to preserve the legacy of those who served and died at Biggin Hill during WWII. Our guided tour follows the story of RAF Biggin Hill through an exceptional collection of stories and objects of those who served here. During our visit, we also enjoy Scones with Tea/Coffee.

Day 4 Today we visit Ightham Mote, a romantic 14th century moated manor house, garden and estate. After lunch we make our way on to Scotney Castle. Wander the garden with a fairytale castle backdrop, with over 770 acres of woodland to explore. Discover the delights of the Victorian country mansion with its secrets and stories. At the end of the day, head to the visitor shop for tasty local produce including the very own Scotney bitter and yummy honey.

Day 5 After breakfast today we return home with suitable comfort stops en-route.
